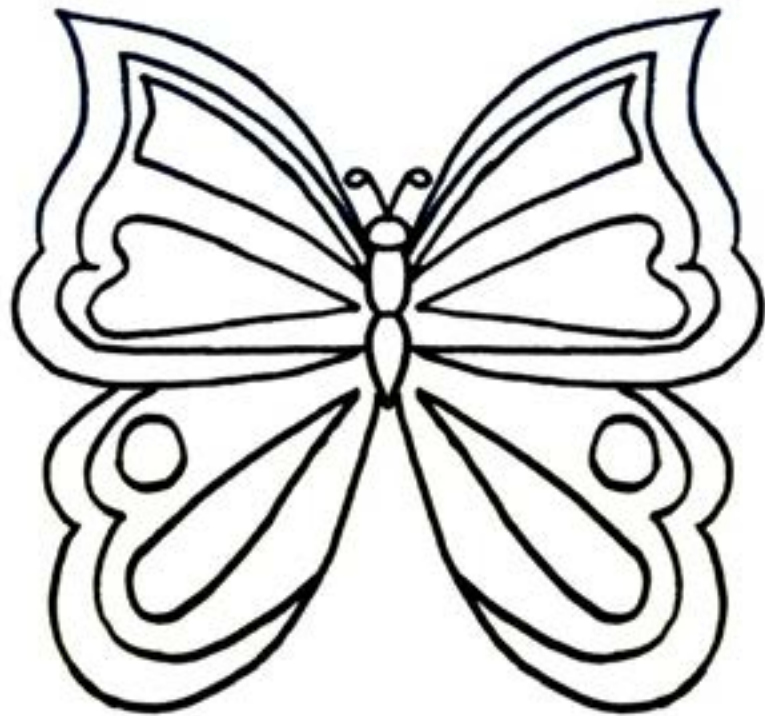

1. Find your favourite colours.
2. Colour "MY" all one colour.
3. Colour each box one colour.
4. Colour "ART" one colour on the front and a second colour on the sides.
5. Use your all white marker to draw stripes on the front of the letters. Turn your lines on an angle on the sides of the letters to give them dimension.
6. Use your all white marker to spell "COOL" inside the boxes. One letter in each box. Then use your black eraser marker to write each letter again, this time slightly off to one side to give it a shadow.



1. Find your colours

~ Eraser: pink, orange

~ Colour Change: blue/ light blue, purple/ pink, yellow/ red, red/ yellow

2. Colour

~ Colour each segment of the butterfly one colour. Make sure the wings match!

3. Colour Change

~ Use the all white marker to add designs to the butterfly. Try dots, stripes, or small shapes.



1. Find your colours

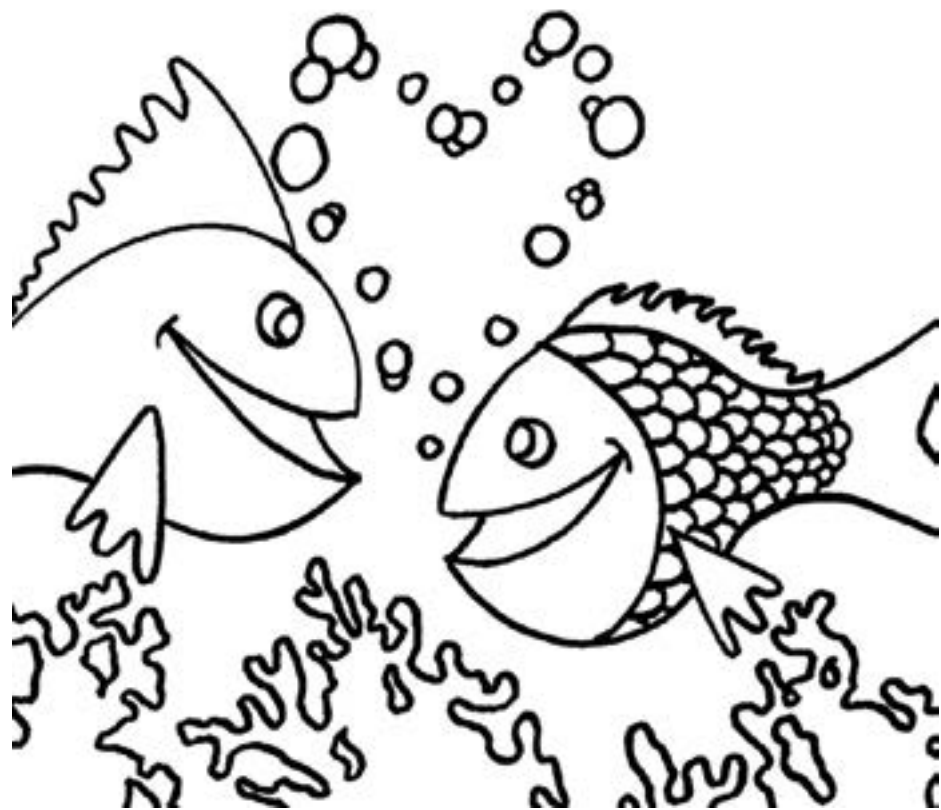
- ~ Purple eraser marker
- ~ Green/ purple colour change marker
- ~ Yellow/ red colour change marker
- ~ Yellow eraser marker

2. Colour

- ~ Use the purple eraser marker for the spaceship
- ~ Use the green/ purple marker for the alien
- ~ Use the yellow/ red marker with red for the dog
- ~ Use the yellow eraser marker for the beam of light and the windows

3. Colour Change

- ~ Use your all white marker to put stripes on the dog
- ~ Now use it to add polka dots to the alien
- ~ Now draw a light stripe along one side of the space ship, following the curve of the ship then do the same to the windows to add shine.



1. Now that you've got the hang of it, try choosing all your own colours!

2. Colour

- ~ Colour the fish on the right multi-coloured by making each scale a different colour
- ~ Try drawing your own scales on the fish on the left.
- ~ Colour the coral one colour
- ~ Colour the bubbles one colour

3. Colour change: white marker

- ~ Add stripes on each scale
- ~ Add dots and swirls on the coral
- ~ Add stripes to the tails and fins of the fish
- ~ Add a small "c" on the left side of each bubble for shine!

BONUS

- ~ Use the extra space above to draw your own fish or other sea creature!



1. Find my colours or choose your own

~ Eraser: blue, yellow

~ Colour change: blue/light blue, green/purple

2. Colour

~ Colour the body with the blue eraser marker

~ Colour the beak and legs yellow

~ Colour the back of the body green

~ Trace the inner part of each feather with a thick green line

~ Colour the rest of tail with the blue colour changing marker

3. Colour change: white marker

~ Draw "u" shapes on the belly as feathers

~ Draw "n" shapes on the back of the body as extra feathers

~ In the blue gaps in the tail, draw your own feathers

~ In the feathers on the tail draw a smaller feather inside, add a small circle in the middle of each.



1. Find my colours or choose your own

~ Colour change: black/pink, green/purple, red/yellow, blue/yellow

2. Colour

~ Colour the wings black

~ Colour the body green

~ Colour the belly red

~ Colour the spikes blue

~ Trace the smoke in blue but leave most of it white

3. Colour change: white marker

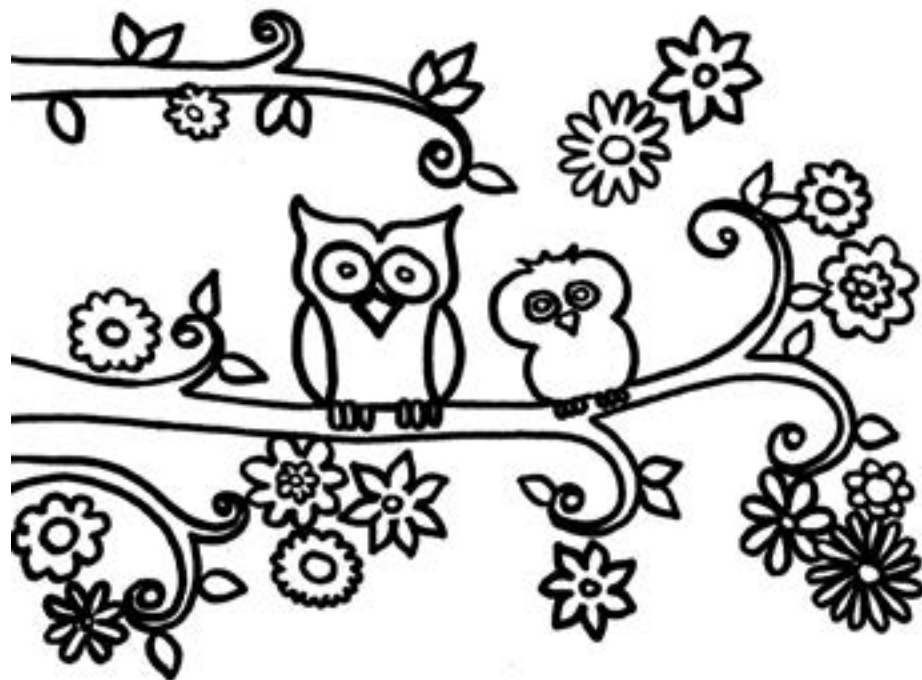
~ Trace the outside edge of the wings. Using thin lines draw veins through the wings.

~ Draw polka dots on the body of the dragon. Make them close together at the tail but more spread out as you go up the body.

~ Colour just the top of each spike

~ Add stripes on the belly

~ Scribble through the smoke



1. Find my colours or choose your own

~ Colour change: blue/light blue, brown/ green, purple/ pink, red/yellow

~Eraser: pink, purple, green, brown

2. Colour

~ Colour each owl one colour

~ Colour each flower one colour, and make the centre a different colour

~ Colour the tree brown and the leaves green

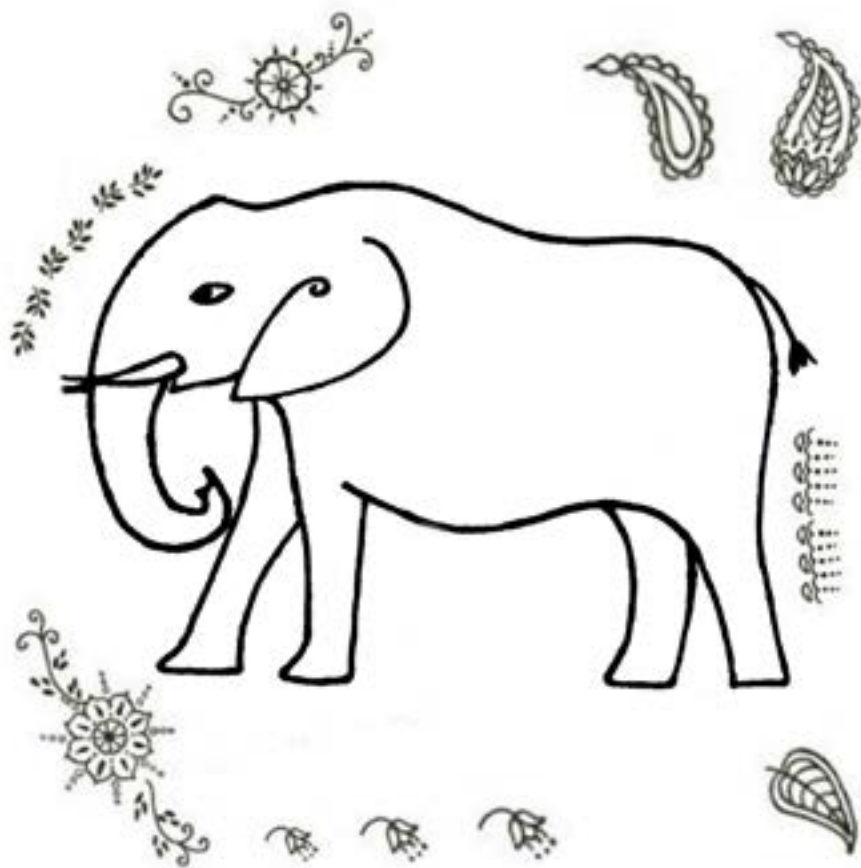
3. Colour change

~ Use your white marker to change the tips of each flower

~ Draw a thin line through the centre of each leaf

~ On the small owl, trace the edge of his body and around the eyes. Add small "u" shapes as feathers on his belly.

~ On the large owl draw small "u" shapes on his belly and wings. Add tiny stripes around the top of his eyes.



1. Find my colours or choose your own

Eraser: blue

Colour change: blue/light blue

2. Colour

~ Alternate between the blue colour change marker and the blue eraser marker by drawing big thick stripes until the whole elephant is blue except for the tusks and the eye.

3. Colour change: white marker

~ Draw henna designs on the elephant's body. Design your own or use the pictures on the side as inspiration!



1. Before colouring, use your all white marker to trace the lines inside the cape.

2. Find your favourite colours and colour the Super Kid picture. Try orange for the hair and gloves, leaving a small space in the middle for the yellow eraser marker.

3. Use your all white marker to trace along the lines on his legs and arms. Add designs like stripes or dots on the word "BAM!": Write another word, like "POW" in the empty shape.

4. Use your all white marker to draw a line in his hair where the orange meets the yellow. Do the same on his gloves. This will make it look like it's shining in those areas.

5. Use your black eraser marker to trace the word you wrote before just slightly off to one side. This will give it a shadow!



1. Find your colours

~ Eraser: green

~ Colour change: blue/light blue, blue/yellow, green/brown, brown/green, red/yellow, purple/pink

2. Colour

~ Colour the bugs and mushroom to your liking. Use only one colour per segment.

3. Colour change

~ Use the white marker to draw different size circles on the mushroom

~ Draw lines on the underside of the mushroom

~ Draw dots on the bodies of the bugs

~ Draw swirls in the bushes

~ Add any other effects you like!



1. Now that you've got the hang of it try choosing all your own colours!

2. Colour

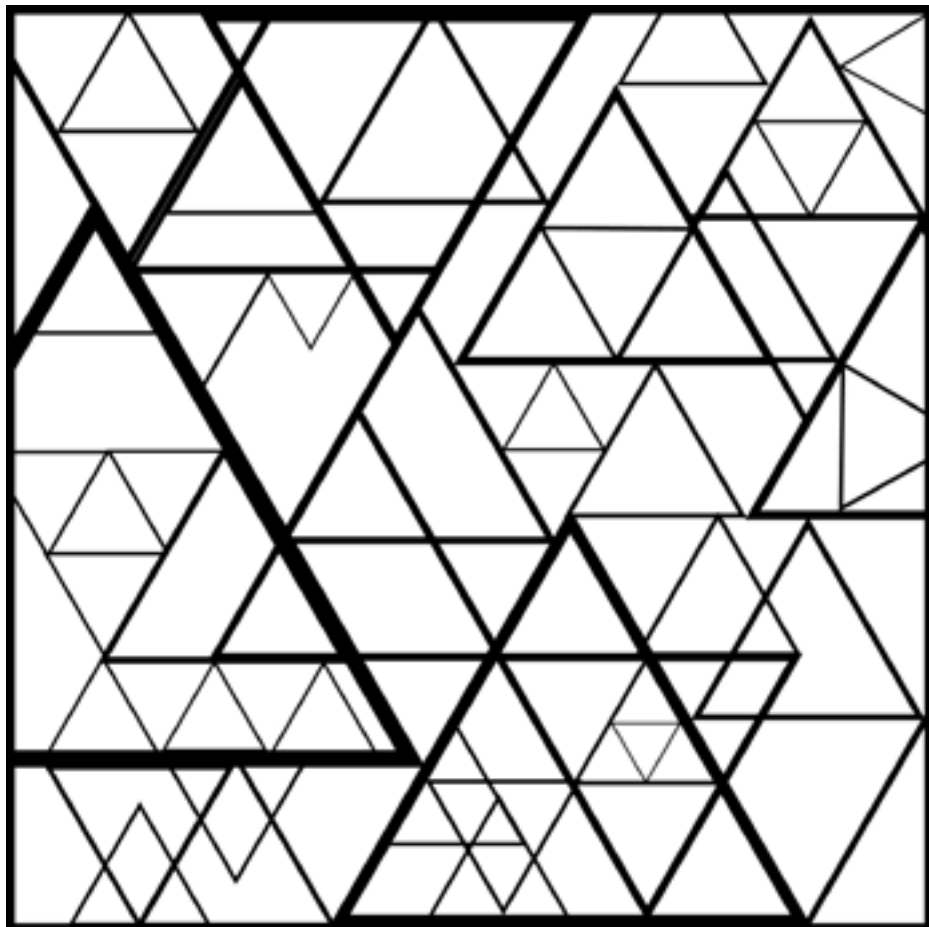
~ Colour some of the stars one colour

~ For other stars try colouring them in stripes of two or more colours

3. Colour change: white marker

~ Add dots, stripes, swirls or other designs to the stars done in a single colour.

~ On stars done in stripes use your white marker to draw stripes in the opposite direction.



1. Now that you've got the hang of it, try choosing all your own colours!

2. Colour

- ~ Colour some of the triangles one colour
- ~ For other triangles try colouring them in stripes of two or more colours
- ~ Feel free to leave some triangles white

3. Colour change: white marker

- ~ Draw designs on the single colour triangles. Try using mostly straight lines.
- ~ On triangles done in stripes use your white marker to draw stripes the opposite direction
